

SHRI REJITH KUMAR'S VISIT TO TAIWAN

The Aarupadai Veedus (6 Army camps of Lord Muruga) were spread across the world during the Kumari Kandam period, as per Lord Muruga's revelation to Shri Rejith Kumar. Lord Muruga has so far revealed the location of four of them to Shri Rejith Kumar.

The first Aarupadai Veedu is in Blue Mountains, Sydney (Australia), the 2nd Aarupadai Veedu is in Reunion Island, and the 3rd Aarupadai Veedu is in Ujjain (India). Recently, Shri Rejith Kumar received a message from Lord Muruga about the location of the 4th Aarupadai Veedu. **The 4th Aarupadai Veedu of Lord Muruga is located in the sea near Taipei (Taiwan). Lord Muruga directed Shri Rejith Kumar to go there and offer his prayers to activate this sacred energy point.**

With Lord Muruga's blessings and under his divine direction Shri Rejith Kumar and Malaysia LMRK Members - Mr. Rajendran @ Vejendran Kumarasamy and Mr. Sugumar Supramaniam reached Taipei on 04-Oct-25 and visited the following sacred sites of Taiwan from 05-Oct-25 to 08-Oct-25.

Sun Moon Lake – Where Nature Meets Spirit



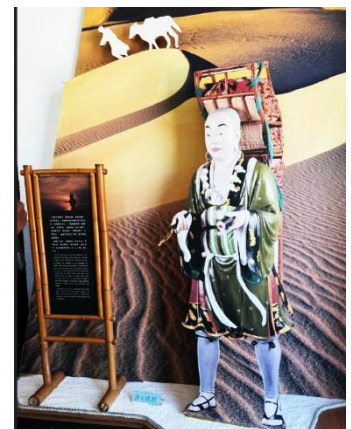

In the heart of Nantou County lies **Sun Moon Lake**, a sanctuary where misty mountains embrace tranquil waters, and the temples stand as silent guardians, watching over the lake with timeless reverence.

Lalu Island, dividing the lake into Sun and Moon, mirrors the celestial rhythm of balance, harmony, and inner peace. (Yin and Yang). Shri Rejith Kumar and the team boarded the boat. We glided over waters that shimmered like liquid glass, reflecting the soft hues of dawn. The gentle rocking of the boat, the whisper of the breeze, and the delicate scent of pine and incense filled the air, carrying a

quiet sense of serenity that seemed to seep into one's soul. Every ripple, every glint of sunlight on the water, was a meditation; every distant chime from the temples invited a pause for reflection and gratitude.

Here, on Sun Moon Lake, time slows, and the boundary between self and nature blurs. The lake is not just seen—it is felt, inhaled, and lived. It is a sacred space where spirit, nature, and stillness converge, leaving an imprint of calm that lingers long after the boat drifts ashore.

Xuanguang Temple

It stands majestically beside the Sun Moon Lake. It was built in honour of the famed world traveller and Venerable Master Xuan Zang (Huen Tsang). This temple is famously known to house the partial relics of Xuan Zang (his head bones). It has been placed in the temple's main hall. Shri Rejith Kumar offered his prayers to Venerable Master Xuan Zang to get his blessings for his duty in Taiwan.

Wenwu Temple



Wenwu Temple

Perched on a mountain slope above the shimmering expanse of **Sun Moon Lake**, Wenwu Temple is a sanctuary where the sacred and the natural intertwine. As you ascend the “Nian Ti” steps (A 366-step stairway symbolizing the days of the year), each step seems to guide your heart upward, inviting reflection and reverence. Along the winding trail, countless blessing bells sway gently in the breeze, carrying whispered prayers across the lake, where sky and water meet in quiet harmony.

It is a unique temple where one can offer two types of prayers – one for ‘Wen’ (Wisdom) and ‘Wu’ for (Success). Wenwu Temple, with its soaring, highly ornamented halls, has been built in the grandeur of Northern Chinese palaces to honour the timeless spirits of the **Founding Ancestor Wenchang Dijun (Patron Saint of Exams and Academics), Warrior Gods Lord Guan Gong and Lord Yue Fei and Venerable Master Confucius (Founder of Confucianism)**.

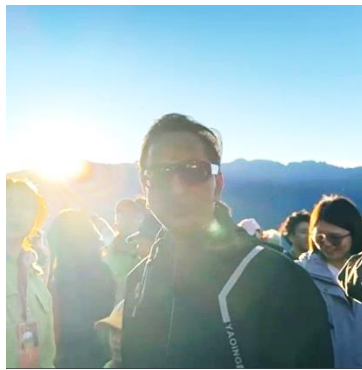

As we walked along the sacred trails of the Alishan forest, it felt as though we had stepped into another realm — a world untouched by time. The serene lakes, cradled within the thick, ancient woods, whispered peace into our hearts and wrapped us in a gentle stillness. It was as if nature herself was breathing prayers into the air.

Wandering through the ancient forest, surrounded by towering cypress trees and the scent of earth and pine, was a soul-stirring experience — one that seemed to whisper stories of time and nature's quiet majesty. Moved by the divine atmosphere, Shri Rejith Kumar began recording a video, speaking of his past prayers in Palani and Ujjain, and how Lord Muruga Perumaan had guided him to Taiwan — not by chance, but by purpose — to experience a revelation or receive a sacred message. His eyes glowed with wonder as he walked

beneath the towering trees, each one standing like a silent sage sharing the wisdom of ages.

For nearly an hour, we wandered in reverence, soaking in the bliss of Mother Nature. The emerald canopy above, the

After spending half of the day soaking in the beauty of the Alishan Forest, Shri Rejith Kumar couldn't help but linger in thought as it had left an unforgettable mark on his heart. However, we realized that it was now time to continue our journey towards Fenchichu Old Street, Lukang Old Street, and the historic Tianhou Temple.

Fenchichu Old Street (Fenquihu)

Nestled in the heart of Taiwan it was once a bustling center for the logging industry in the 19th century. With the timber industry booming it became a vital trading center for workers and a resting spot for travellers. In the mid-20th century the logging industry declined making it a charming quiet town. Walking along its cobblestone streets, we could get a glimpse of the rich heritage in terms of its traditional architectural style and get the nostalgic feel of a bygone era. The quaint old shops, eateries, and the tea houses showcasing Taiwanese cuisine made our visit there a delightful experience.

Lukang Old Street and Tianhou Temple

Located in Changhua County, Lukang Old Street is a beautifully preserved historic district that showcases Taiwan's traditional charm through its narrow brick lanes, red-tiled roofs, and vibrant

artisan shops. Visitors can stroll among old merchant houses, sample local delicacies like ox-tongue biscuits, and experience the atmosphere of Taiwan's early trading days.

With over 400 years of history, the temple is renowned for its intricate carvings, rich cultural heritage, and its role as a spiritual center for Goddess Mazu's worship. The Tianhou Temple in Lukang is not simply a religious site—it's a living symbol of Taiwan's maritime heritage, traditional architecture, and folk faith. It connects Taiwan's past as a seafaring society with its ongoing devotion to Mazu, the protective goddess who watches over the island, especially the seafaring communities. Together, these

Morning of Grace and Blessings at Taiwan Warehouse Solutions (TWS) HQ, Yangmei

There are moments in life that leave an imprint in one's soul—moments when the energy in a space shifts, hearts open, and a quiet, profound peace fills the room. Yesterday was one such morning, as we travelled from Taichung to Yangmei to visit Taiwan Warehouse Solutions (TWS) Headquarters. Shri Rejith Kumar's purpose of visiting TWS was to perform Pancha Bhootha Pooja, for the TWS staff through which they were immensely blessed.

From the moment we arrived, we were met with warmth and care by Director Kenny and TWS Service Manager Mr. Allen. Kenny had lovingly prepared everything for the prayer, ensuring a serene and welcoming space. Following Shri Rejith Kumar's guidance, Sugumar brought a picture of Lord Palani Muruga, and together we set up a prayer table adorned with fresh flowers and a gently flickering oil lamp.

For the Pancha Bhootha Pooja, the ceremony began with the *Kandha Sashti Kavasam* chant, filling the room with divine vibrations to invoke the blessings of Lord Muruga. Each participant offered rose petals after making a prayerful intention (sankalpam) for their own well-being, as well as for the growth and success of TWS. Around thirty staff members participated, many experiencing emotions they had never felt before—some were moved to tears as they connected with the sacred energies of Lord Muruga.

For many, this was a first encounter with such a prayer ceremony, and perhaps even the first prayer to Lord Muruga in this part of Taiwan. Yet, Lord Muruga in His divine compassion made His presence palpable, touching hearts and elevating spirits. The energy was subtle yet powerful—several felt their bodies lighten and their minds calm, without fully understanding how, only sensing that something extraordinary was unfolding.

The prayer lasted about 30 minutes, yet the impact lingered long after. There was a shared sense of serenity, joy, and satisfaction among all present. We captured the moment with group photos, but the true memory will forever reside in the hearts of everyone there. Shri Rejith Kumar extended a heartfelt invitation to Mr. Kenny and the TWS team to join the Palani prayers in March 2025, continuing this beautiful spiritual connection. It was an unforgettable experience, one that words can scarcely capture. Yet for those who were present, the room's energy, the vibrations of the prayers, and the gentle grace of the Lord left an imprint that will resonate for years to come.

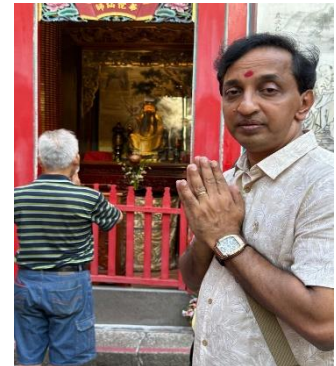
Longshan Temple



Longshan Temple

Longshan Temple (Bangka Lungshan Temple) is a Taiwanese folk temple in Wanhua District. Taiwan has 3 major religions – Buddhism, Confucianism and Taoism. The Longshan temple has shrines representing each of them.

The **Longshan temple** was built in 1738 by settlers from Fujian province of China during Qing rule in honour of the temple's principal deity – **Goddess Guanyin (Goddess of Mercy)**.

Guishan Island: A Voyage of the Soul

Shri Rejith Kumar set sail toward **Guishan Island**, guided not only by curiosity but by a quiet call to the open sea. He had reminded us that this journey was more than sightseeing—it was to offer prayers to the 4th Aarupadai Veedu of Lord Muruga, located in the sea as per the Lord Muruga's divine direction.

The boat cut through the waves, each ripple like a gentle heartbeat of the Earth. The horizon stretched infinitely, and the sea seemed to whisper timeless truths: of patience, of surrender, and the beauty of letting go. The sun poured warmth upon us, and the wind carried the salty scent of freedom, reminding us that the world is far larger than our everyday worries.

Around us, whales and dolphins played in the distance, symbols of freedom and grace, echoing the rhythm of the universe. Each leap, each splash, felt like a message: life is fleeting, yet profoundly beautiful.

About 45 minutes into our voyage, Shri Rejith Kumar guided us to the front of the boat. He held rose petals in his hands and with quiet reverence, released them into the waves and offered prayers to Lord Muruga to invoke His divine grace to make His 4th Padai Veedu (Army camp) active. The rose petals danced briefly on the surface, then merged into the vastness of the sea.

We watched, humbled, as the petals disappeared into the sea - as it was a historic moment that will be forever etched in our hearts and in the pages of Mother Earth's history. *The power and divine grace of Lord Muruga through his 4th Padai Veedu had just begun to flow from here to the world. Through the benevolent grace of Lord Muruga, the completion of the duty in Taiwan will effect many positive changes in the world.*

For two hours, we drifted in this sacred space, between sky and sea, between the seen and the unseen. When we returned to shore, it was with hearts quieted, minds opened, and a lingering sense of connection—not just with the sea, but with the profundity of what had just happened. As we prepared to continue to Yangmingshan National Park, we carried with us more than memories: we carried the stillness that stems from the sacred presence of the ocean, the humility and gratitude in our hearts for the wondrous opportunity Lord Muruga had given us to partake and witness His divinity in action.

Yangmingshan National Park

It sounds like our itinerary shifted from a coastal experience to a mountainous one, which can indeed feel puzzling at first! Yangmingshan National Park is quite different from a beach setting—it's famous for its volcanic landscapes, hot springs, lush hiking trails, and cherry blossoms (depending on the season). While the sea offers relaxation and the thrill of waves, Yangmingshan provides a serene, nature-immersed experience with cooler temperatures, panoramic views, and opportunities to explore Taiwan's geothermal activity.

We arrived at the site just as the weather began to shift. The clouds descended around us like a living veil, soft and whispering, turning the world into a dreamscape. Our vision was limited, yet in that misty obscurity, every shape and shadow seemed charged with life. From the earth beneath, warm steam rose from the hot springs, curling upward like delicate, glowing fingers—nature itself breathing in rhythm with the mountains.

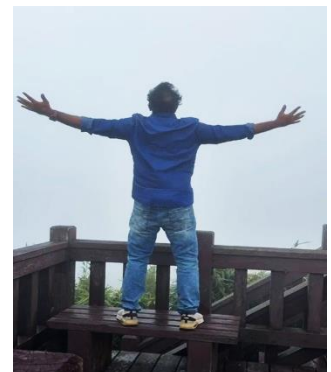
Shri Rejith Kumar quietly attuned to the energy of the place and felt a profound bliss washing over him. He sought a spot which captured the very essence of the park, which would resonate with LMRK Members. After wandering around a few locations, he discovered it—a slight elevation, where clouds swirled like smoke around him, and the wind moved with a purposeful, almost sentient force.

As the video camera captured the moment, the gusts of wind seemed to rise and fall with the cadence of his words. When he uttered “Muruga Perumaan,” the clouds parted just enough to catch a fleeting beam of sunlight, illuminating the spot in a soft, golden glow. It was as if the elements themselves were listening, responding in quiet reverence. Tiny droplets of mist sparkled like suspended diamonds in the air, and a distant bird call echoed with perfect timing—a coincidental harmony that felt orchestrated by some unseen hand. The air seemed charged with energy, leaving us breathless, suspended between reality and a dream. A perfect setting for a divine message.

Shri Rejith Kumar gave an important message about the Taiwan Duty from Yangmingshan National Park to Muruga Devotees from all over the world. “I have completed the Pooja for activating the 4th Padai Veedu. My duties in Taiwan were to offer prayers to Lord Muruga and seek his blessings for: i) Activating the 4th Padai Veedu, ii) Reconnecting Kumari Kandam souls with our world, and iii) For the New World Order (India-China-Russia) to become powerful.

Shafts of light pierced through the clouds in random, magical bursts, illuminating the trail in fleeting golden patterns. Every rustle of leaves, every soft gurgle of the stream, seemed like nature itself was celebrating our journey. By the time we reached the van, our hearts were overflowing—not merely with happiness, but with a deep, serene joy, a feeling that we had glimpsed something sacred and timeless. We returned, our spirits lighter, our minds clearer, carrying with us the memory of a place where clouds, wind, and sunlight conspired to create magic—and where every moment felt like a gentle, divine embrace.
